Demands

◆ Enable Global South economic sovereignty

Policies

- ◆ Complete, immediate, and unconditional debt cancellation for the South
- ◆ Create cooperative, feminist economies for care and justice
- ◆ Demilitarize, for liberation and a just peace, centering and investing in care, life, and dignity for all.
- ◆ Democratize and transform global economic governance
- ◆ Ensure the freedom of movement and the protection of the rights of refugees, migrants, and displaced peoples
- ◆ Materialize South-South solidarity
- ◆ Reject the primacy of economic growth and profit
- ◆ Reparations for slavery, extraction & ecological damage by Global North
- ◆ Scale up the provision of transparent and gender-disaggregated data

Tactics

- ◆ Hold elite-led NGOs accountable and reject their dominance
- ◆ Hold states accountable through reforms
- ◆ Mobilize global North actors to dismantle unjust systems from within
- ◆ Raise awareness of ecological & historical debts owed by the North
- ◆ Reclaim & reshape multilateralism
- ◆ Reclaim sovereignty through pan-Africanism & pan-Latin Americanism

02 Breaking the shackles of debt and financial imperialism

Demands

◆ **Cancel the debt**

Policies

- ◆ Complete, immediate, and unconditional debt cancellation for the South
- ◆ Democratize and transform global economic governance
- ◆ End austerity and prioritize public service provision
- ◆ Materialize South-South solidarity
- ◆ Reject the primacy of economic growth and profit

Tactics

- ◆ Conduct independent, feminist, people's debt audits
- ◆ Continue engaging in IFI spaces, but seek to dismantle them
- ◆ Create alternative spaces outside failed systems
- ◆ Expose colonial debt as illegitimate
- ◆ Hold IFIs accountable for deepening crises
- ◆ Leverage Jubilee 2025 for debt cancellation
- ◆ Mobilize global North actors to dismantle unjust systems from within
- ◆ Support the FfD borrowers' club for debt justice

03 End wealth disparity and finance social services through a just, progressive, and gender-transformative tax system

Demands

- ◆ **Just and gender-transformative taxation**

Policies

- ◆ End illicit financial flows and abolish tax havens that enable the accumulation of wealth among corporations
- ◆ Institute progressive and proportional taxation of major wealth and capital accumulation, assets, and income, while abolishing regressive taxes such as the value-added tax (VAT) and removing taxes on essential products, such as reproductive and health products

Tactics

- ◆ Build regional consensus on "polluter pays" and taxing the rich
- ◆ Ensure tax transparency with data disaggregated by gender, age, race, etc.
- ◆ Expose corporate capture linked to militarization & oppression

Outcomes

- ◆ Inclusive and transparent data accessible to all
- ◆ More equal economies within and between countries
- ◆ Publicly financed universal access to affordable essentials and quality services that reduce gendered care burdens

◆ **Feminist liberation and gender equality**



- ◆ The provision of predictable, unconditional, adequate, and new and additional climate finance by Global North countries to the Global South

Tactics

- ◆ Amplify gender-just climate leadership
- ◆ Center historically marginalized communities in climate policy
- ◆ Expose false climate solutions, incl. digital transitions
- ◆ Target Global North laws on consumption & extractivism

Outcomes

- ◆ A just transition to renewable energy suited to local economic & social realities
- ◆ An end to fossil fuel expansion with repair of existing harms
- ◆ Nature, land, and sacred spaces are preserved and protected
